Deadline for Christmas dinner is Friday 19th November, if you wish your child to have a Christmas dinner please return your slip with your child's choice by this date. Many thanks

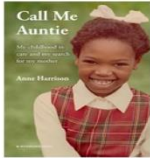
PUPILS ABSENCE

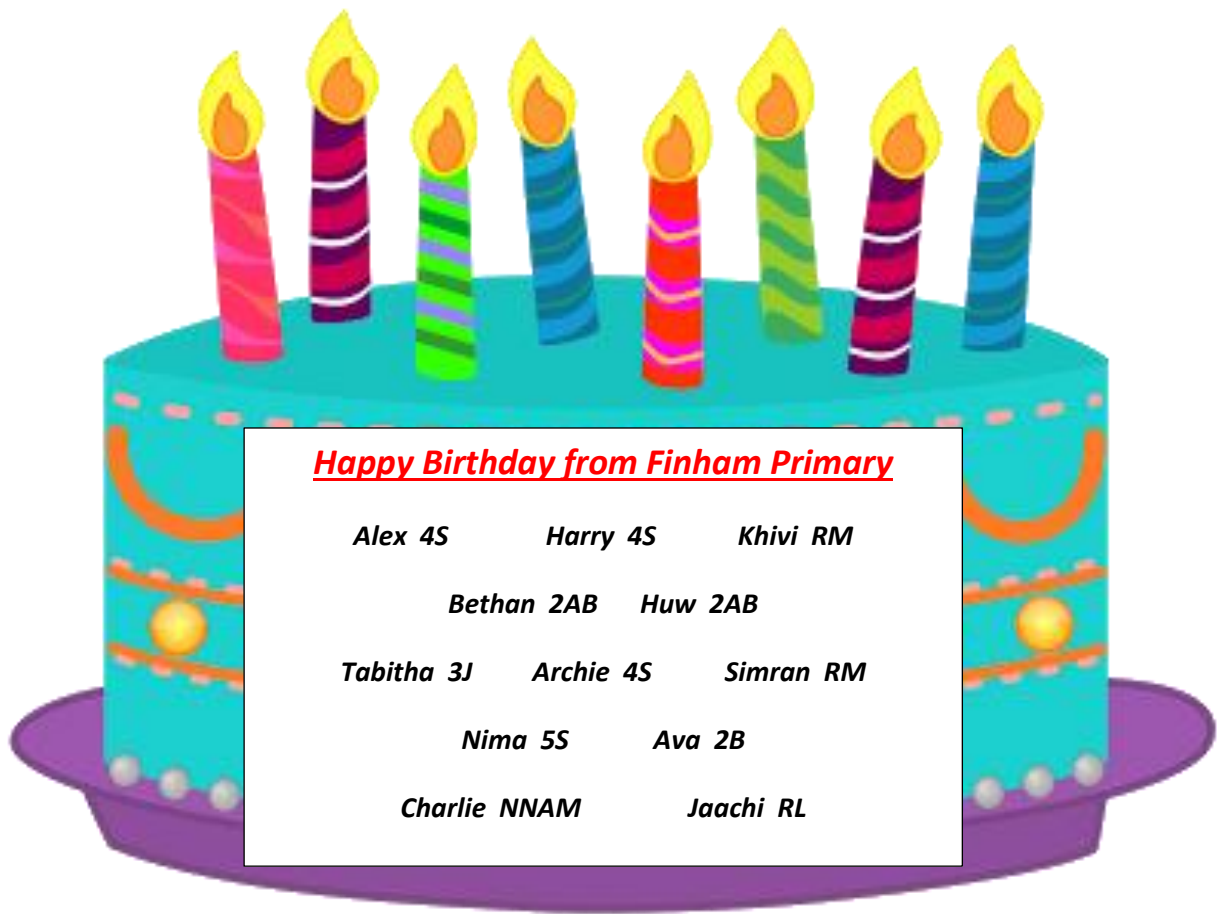
